Camp Nocatee, Clewiston General Information

- 1. LOCATION OF CAMP SIZE OF CAMP AND USE BY AGE LEVEL, TROOP/GROUPS:** 4009 Flaghole Road, Clewiston, FL 33440. The camp is 640 , located southwest of Clewiston on Flaghole Road. Facilities provide Troop/Group Camping for Brownie, Junior, and Senior Ambassador Age levels.

- 4. CHECK-IN/ CHECK-OUT TIMES:**
Arrangements to be made at time of camp registration. Leaders need to inspect site prior to site manager check out.
- 5. CARS :** One (1) vehicle at each camp site for emergencies. All other vehicles **MUST** be parked in Parking lot.
- 6. AMERICAN FLAG & FLAG POLE:**
There is a flag and flagpole at each site.
- 7. ELECTRICAL:** Leave all breakers ON at all times, even when you leave. Do turn off lights when you leave. Upon arrival turn on hot water (switch box outside of bath house wall). Turn OFF when departing.
- 8. SLEEPING MATTRESSES:** Located inside each cabin with cots. **DO NOT MOVE COTS.** Place mattresses on side upon departure.
- 9. LIGHTS:** Turn off during daylight hours and upon departure.
- 10. GARBAGE:** Do not leave garbage outside at night. Troops must bring own garbage bags. Garbage is to be taken to dumpster at time of departure. Dumpster is located at the left corner of Site Manager's driveway.
- 11.** The camp has five sites equipped with five cabins, sleeping eight people per cabin, 40 people per site.
- 12.** Site 6 is reserved for Cadettes, Seniors, and Ambassadors. It is equipped with three tree house cabins, sleeping 8 per cabin and an ADA accessible troop house.
- 13.** Site 5 is ADA accessible.
- 14.** There are two covered fire circles at each site (1-5), for cooking all types of weather. Site 6 has one covered fire circle.
- 15.** You can bring firewood to camp. Be sure to take home any firewood that you bring and do not use.
- 16. CARSON'S COMMONS**
 - Founder's Hall (activity and dining center) is used for Resident Camp and area events. If kitchen is used, you must have a certified food manager.
 - Cook's Cabin (for certified food manager)
 - Infirmary (Resident Camp)
 - Trading Post (Resident Camp)
 - Staff House (Resident Camp)
 - Director's Cabin (Resident Camp)
 - Semler Nature Center
 - Arts and Craft Center (Located behind Founder's Hall)

17. LANGFORD LAKE:

- Waterfront Director's cabin and bathhouse.
- Boat house and boat rack contain several canoes and johnboats. The canoes and johnboats are available for use under the supervision of certified instructors.
- Barbecue pit available upon request.
- Shelter
- Swimming Pool (must have lifeguard and proper personnel)
- There is **NO SWIMMING** in the lake due to state health regulations.

18.. SPORTS FIELD: Is located across from the farm- hard court, shelter, running water.

PROCEDURE UPON ARRIVAL/CHECK IN:

1. Please try to have your group arrive together.
2. Please do not climb the fence or blow the horn.
3. Please have the **Roster** of all girls and adults in your group staying at your Unit, to be given Ranger.
- 4.. You must show your confirmation and proof of camp training. Certified persons must show current certification and driver license. Please make sure certifications are current.
5. Each troop/group will be checked in upon arrival and checked out before departure. This will enable us to keep Nocatee in good condition.
6. One unit key will be given to the Trained Camper upon arrival and will be collected at check out.
7. Camp gear and personal equipment may be taken to each site, via a caravan of vehicles.

8. **ALL VEHICLES**, except for ONE (1) emergency vehicle, will return to parking lot immediately (located by Site Manager's house).

10. The speed limit at camp is **10 MILES PER HOUR!**

Please watch out for campers and stay within the speed limit.

11. Do not leave camp except for an emergency or a trip to the store for emergency supplies only.

12. **TAKE INVENTORY** – Make note if something is missing & let the Ranger know.

BATH HOUSE RULES:

1. DO NOT wash dishes in the sinks.
2. DO NOT prepare food in bathhouses.
3. **BENCHES** are to keep clothes from getting wet when taking showers –NOT for standing on!
4. **CAUTION- WATER MAY BE HOT!**
5. Provide separate time for men (lock door and post sign). Sanitary napkin disposal containers are located in each stall. Please be sure to instruct all female adults and teens to properly use them after lined with small paper bags.
6. You may use **HOT WATER** for dishwashing (instead of boiling).

TROOP HOUSE RULES:

1. **SMOKING IS PERMITTED IN DESIGNATED AREAS ONLY!** You must provide your own sand ash cans.
2. Bulletin boards are provided. Do not tack any item on walls or outside of building.
3. Electric coffee pots are permitted only in the troop house.

5. Cabin floodlights are left on at night and should be turned off in the morning.

- Wipe tables down.
- Sweep floor.
- Rake around Unit House, if needed.

6. Adult women should sleep in separate cabins from girls.
7. Men should sleep in a different cabin than the women.
8. Brooms are provided in each cabin behind the door. Brooms are to be left in cabin.

FIRE RING RULES:

- Small fires only under cook shelter.
- Keep safety equipment at site at any time there is a fire (shovel, and full water buckets).
- DO NOT move picnic tables from fire area.
- Bring your own fire wood or use wood at camp.
- Have garbage bags on site when cooking and preparing food.
- Campfires are permitted under cook shelters at night. REMEMBER- keep it small.
- REMEMBER to have at the cook site - kaper charts, pitalator, dishwashing set up, clothesline, and 1 adult observing each patrol.

CLEAN-UP AND CHECK-OUT:

KITCHEN:

- Collect all garbage bags and keep cans supplied during the weekend.
- Turn down the temperature on the refrigerator (if you adjusted the setting upon arrival). Clean inside and out, wipe dry. Do not leave ice.
- Remove all supplies left in kitchen.
- Return all camp equipment to proper places.
- All buckets should be cleaned, dried and placed right side up.
- Sweep floors.
- Take garbage to the dumpster when leaving campsite upon departure.

UNIT HOUSE:

- Remove all troop/group supplies. Do not leave open toilet paper take home with you.
- Remove all your troop/group items from bulletin board (leave Nocatee information sheets posted).

GROUNDS AND FIRE PIT:

- Pick-up all wrappers, trash, etc. from grounds.
- Clean fire ring of all unburned wood and charcoal. (Charcoal should be removed and put in empty charcoal bag after fire is dead out and either disposed of in dumpster or taken home). Rake out fire ring.
- Take home unburned wood that you brought from home.
- Remove all plastic, boxes, etc. and discard in dumpster.
- Clean and put away all equipment, including dried dishwashing set-up (store upside down-PYRAMID-STYLE)

BATH HOUSE:

- TURN OFF HOT WATER HEATER!
- Clean sinks and toilets.
- Empty trash. Empty all sanitary napkin disposal containers.
- Remove all toilet paper, soap and all items from showers, back of toilets, and shelves. (Leave one roll of toilet paper in first stall for emergencies).
- Sweep floors (if muddy, hose out and sweep out water with broom).

CABIN CLEAN UP:

- Check rafters and stand mattresses up.
- Sweep cabin, including all wall edges, shelves and steps.
- Clean up around cabin and under steps, rake around cabins if needed.
