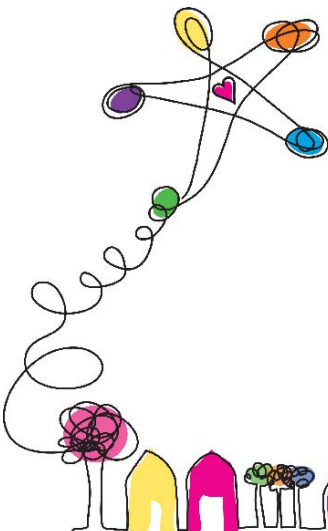
The Power of Pathways

For: Service Unit Leadership Teams, Recruitment Managers, and other Volunteers recruiting girls and adults.

Camp, Events, Series, Travel, Troop and Virtual.....These six words (we call them "Pathways") represent how girls can enter and participate in Girl Scouting. Pathways offer girls and their families the opportunities to customize their Girl Scout Leadership Experience. They can choose one, some, or all-all year round!

This course will provide definitions and descriptions of the six Girl Scout Pathways and how the message of Pathways should be incorporated into all Council recruitment events and materials to maximize results. The course will also share the best practices for Service Unit team structures to integrate Pathways recruitment and support Pathways program delivery within adult volunteer roles.

Take a tour of some of the technology tools we use in our communication with girls and their families, volunteers and others interested in learning more about Girl Scouts.

Lights, Camera, Action! Producing Large Events

For: Volunteers working in Troop, Series, Camp, and Event Pathways.

This workshop is loaded with good ideas and helpful hints for producing a large event with your troop/group, Service Unit, council events, program committees, etc. Facilitators will offer tips on goal setting, targeting your audience, understanding the purpose, setting budgets, suggesting committee positions/descriptions, and learn how to market your event. Be prepared to have fun in this workshop and share your vision for your next large event.

Re-discover, Connect & Take Action: A Community Experience for girls of all ages

For: Volunteers working in a Troop and/or Travel Pathway.

After taking this workshop, you will understand the 3 keys of the (GSLE) Girl Scout Leadership Experience: Discover, Connect & Take Action. Facilitators will host an exciting workshop loaded with places to visit within the communities of our Girl Scout Council. Girls of all ages will "discover" and have fun. It doesn't stop there! Find out how to "connect" with people while taking your trip. (Possibly a sister troop can join you from another area of the council?) As a troop/group, girls can "take action" by discussing how they can "make the world a better place." Steps to working on a "take action" plan will also be provided in this workshop. Participants will receive a resource booklet after completing the workshop. Please be prepared to share success stories about places your troop has already traveled.

Songs & Ceremonies... A Girl Scout Tradition:

For: Volunteers working in a Troop, Series, Camp, Event and Travel Pathways.

Back by popular demand! Plan to have fun in this Songs & Ceremonies workshop. Facilitators will demonstrate traditional songs and official ceremonies that you can share with other adults and Girl Scouts of all ages. A CD will be included for participants who complete this workshop.

Taking a Journey through the Bronze Award: Understanding the highest award for Junior Girl Scouts.

For: Volunteers working with Junior Girl Scouts in a Troop Pathway.

As a Girl Scout troop/group volunteer, you will work with and inspire a team of Girl Scout Juniors to make a difference in the Girl Scout local community and help each girl achieve the highest honor a Girl Scout Junior can earn—the Girl Scout Bronze Award. After completing this workshop, you and the girls will have fun along the way as you help them to bring their own unique creativity to all they do and achieve. This workshop will guide you toward the 7 steps to complete the new Journey-based Bronze Award. Participants will receive an Adult Volunteer Guide, as well as a copy of the Guidelines for Junior Girl Scouts after completing this workshop.
