LOCATION OF CAMP, SIZE OF CAMP AND USE BY AGE LEVEL, TROOPS/GROUPS:

10205 SE Girl Scout Camp Road,
Tequesta, FL 33469.
The camp is 640 acres, located off
County Line Road and is part of
Jonathan Dickinson State Park. Facilities
are provided for daytime and
Troop/Group Camping for Daisy,
Brownie, Junior, Cadette, Senior and
Ambassador age levels.

CHECK IN/CHECK OUT TIMES:

Arrangements are made in advance with
the Camp Ranger. Information is
provided in the confirmation packet.

CARS: One (1) vehicle at each campsite
for emergencies. All other vehicles **MUST**
be parked in the Parking Lot.

AMERICAN FLAG & FLAG POLE: There
is a flag and flagpole at each campsite.

ELECTRICAL: Leave all breakers ON at
all times, even when you leave. DO turn
off all lights when you leave.

SLEEPING MATTRESSES: Stack neatly
in storage room, in unit house, upon
departure. Mats should be wiped down,
but dried before storage.

LIGHTS: Turn off during daylight hours
and upon departure.

GARBAGE: Do not leave garbage
outside at night. Troops must bring own
garbage bags. Garbage is to be taken to
dumpster at time of departure. Dumpster
is located at the left corner of Site
Manager's driveway. Dumpster is located
next to Parking lot shelter.

TENTS: Upon departure, roll down front
and rear flaps.

REFRIGERATION: Please note that
there are **NO** refrigerators in the Unit
Houses at any site. Ice is available from
the ice machines at the Parking Lot
shelter and the Lodge back porch.

SANDY RIDGE: This cabin unit is
typically used for Daisy and Brownie
troops and groups. There are 8 cabins
each sleeping 4, a fire circle, a Unit House
which may be used for eating and
activities, 4 showers, a sink and 4 toilets
and a pavilion with picnic tables.

HILLSIDE: This cabin unit is typically
used for Brownie troops and groups.
There are 6 cabins each sleeping 4, a
fire circle, a Unit House which may be
used for eating and activities, 4 showers,
a sink and 4 toilets, and a pavilion with
picnic tables.

EASTWIND: This is a platform tent unit.
There are 8 tents each sleeping 4, a fire
circle, a Unit House which may be used
for eating and activities, 4 showers, a
sink, 4 toilets, and a pavilion with
picnic tables.

CEDAR HOLLOW: This is a platform tent unit. There are 4 tents each sleeping 4, a fire circle, a Unit House which may be used for eating and activities, 2 showers, a sink, 2 toilets, and a pavilion with picnic tables.

MEADOW: This is a platform tent unit. There are 8 tents each sleeping 4, a fire circle, a Unit House which may be used for eating and activities, 4 showers, a sink, 4 toilets, and a pavilion with picnic tables.

OUTPOST: This is a platform tent unit. There are 8 tents each sleeping 4, a fire circle, a Unit House which may be used for eating and activities, 4 showers, a sink, 4 toilets, and a pavilion with picnic tables.

WHISPERING WOODS: Air Conditioned Bunk House that is ADA accessible.

COOK'S CABIN: Air Conditioned Double-cabin unit with screened area in the middle. This unit sleeps 14 people and has an attached bathroom and shower.

GATE: The gate is locked by the Ranger each evening at 10:00 p.m. If there is an emergency, please contact the Ranger at his house: (561)746-4030.

ARCHERY RANGE: Contact the Ranger if you would like to use the archery equipment. You must have a certified archery instructor with you if you plan to use the archery equipment.

SPORTS COURT: There is a tennis court/basketball court available near the parking lot. Notify the Ranger if you need to use the tennis racquets (you will need to supply your own balls). If you would like to use the basketball hoops, you will

need to supply your own basketballs.

CANOES: If you would like to use the canoes, please contact the Property Coordinator at 954-739-7660 Ext. 1200..

LAKE AKALEW: The Lake has canoes, a boathouse with paddles and lifejackets. There are fishing poles available and a large fire circle and a pavilion with picnic tables.

PROCEDURES:

CHECK IN: The Ranger will be notified ahead of time when campers are arriving and will meet you in the parking lot. You will need to give him your final roster of all girls and adults attending, as well as copies of all applicable certifications with photo ID..

SHOWERS:

1. Don't wash dishes or prepare food in the sinks.
2. Make sure all soap, shampoo, and hair accessories are removed from shower area upon departure.
3. Tip shower grates on their sides and sweep out showers upon departure.

BATHROOMS:

1. Scrub toilets, remove toilet paper from stalls, empty trash and sweep stall floors upon departure.
2. Do not flush sanitary supplies in toilets.

CARE OF TENTS:

1. Check tents for damage, and note what needs to be repaired before and after using.
2. Report repairs needed on inventory sheet.
3. Four (4) girls per tent. Same for adults. Adult Women sleep in separate tents/cabins than girls. Men sleep in different

tents/ cabins than women.

4. DO NOT use any sprays such as insect repellent, hairspray, or deodorant inside of tents.

5.No Food , drinks,candy, gum,etc. is allowed in tents at any time. It attracts bugs and termites.

6. DO not hang anything on tents, ropes or wood supports. Put up clotheslines.

7. SO not touch canvas tents when wet. It will cause leaks.

8.Upon departure – roll down front and rear tent flaps. Remove clotheslines.
