Badge Components

1. Learn digital video basics

2. Film. Then film some more... and 3. Pick the perfect subject

Pre-production - create a story board. You will need to think about the following:

- What is your story?
- Who are the characters?
- What do you want the viewer to see?

4. Action!

Get to making your movie—

- Try to capture all the raw footage you will need for your movie, including different angle of the same moment and any transition or action shots you will need.

5. Edit and premiere your movie

Edit your movie—

- Add music, add images, shorten the movie, cut out bits you don't want to include etc.

You can use one of the following to edit your movie (check with an adult first):

- Download Filmora 9 (for Mac or Windows - Free download)
- Download Windows Movie Maker (may be installed on your windows computer already (not for Mac))
- iMovie already on iPhone or iPad, etc

Share your masterpiece with someone

- You could show someone in your family, post your video on social media (check with an adult first) and tag Girl Scouts of Southeast Florida or e mail it to us so we can see what you are doing and maybe share it on our social media or you could host a movie premiere in your living room and invite everyone in your home to join you.
