Badge Overview

Our digital world makes it easy to stay in touch and share friendships, memories, and ideas. But we've all heard embarrassing stories in which people wish they'd never hit the "send" button. Once you've put it out there, it never goes away. But you can use that to your benefit, too. This badge is all about knowing how to make positive choices in the online world. When I've earned this badge, I'll know how to make — and keep — my online world a positive place.

Badge Components Part 1

1. Explore "oops!" and "wow!" moments

Let's take a moment and think about what "oops" and "wow" moments are online.

- O What are some "oops" that can happen, when something is shared online that shouldn't have been?
- O What are some "wow" moments, when the power of the Internet was used for good?

2. Dig into stories of "ouch" -- and repair some hurt if necessary

Online bullying is something that happens very frequently.

- O Why do you think that online bullying is so prevalent?
- What are some characteristics of online communication that make it easy to bully people?

After thinking about online bullying, watch <u>this video</u> that talks about how you can overcome online bullying.

3. Look at email, commenting, or blogging

Email is a great tool to use to communicate! You can use it to send a message to almost anyone: your teachers, Girl Scout sisters, and even your friends. With the variety of people that you can email, it is important to remember that there is different etiquette that you should use when you're messaging someone.
