Girl Scout Strong. That is how we would define our 2021-2022 year. As we continue to navigate a post-pandemic world, we made great strides across our organization and we faced adversity with the courage, confidence, and character that we instill in our girls.

Membership grew! We increased both girl and adult membership for the first time in many years and we welcomed 2,230 NEW Girl Scouts and their families. We could not have done that without the tireless commitment of our volunteer leadership who continue to say "YES" to girls and create experiences for Girl Scouts that continue to inspire and engage them.

We served thousands of Girl Scouts through innovative and interactive programs in STEM, Entrepreneurship, the Outdoors, and Life Skills. We reminded girls to practice self-care through "Be Kind to Your Mind," and brought them up-close and personal with amazing women mentors who helped them explore careers, learn business skills, and appreciate the value of mentoring.

Girls showed they were S.M.A.R.T. (Savvy, Motivated, Artistic, Responsible, and Technical) Cookies all throughout the year, including when they met our Cookie Customers—and they earned nearly \$1.1 million in troop proceeds to support their Girl Scout experience. Girls' online presence during the sale and their use of technology to support their goals was incredible, with online sales up almost 40 percent from the prior year.

Our Council celebrated 27 new Gold Award Girl Scouts this year and are so proud of the 180 Girl Scouts who earned the Bronze and Silver Awards. Combined, these girls provided over 6,000 hours of service to their communities, and many continue to serve others through their amazing projects.

Our Emerald Award and Girl Scouts Lead the Way events honored ten incredible women who exemplify leadership and who are role models for girls. Combined, they raised over \$200,000 to support our commitment that financial need will not be a barrier to becoming a Girl Scout.

Partnerships continue to strengthen the foundation of Girl Scouts and we are grateful to the corporations, foundations, organizations, and individuals whose commitments of resources and expertise expand our reach and our ability to serve girls. Our work is better because of your support and commitment to our Mission to build girls of courage, confidence, and character who make the world a better place.

As we look forward to growing our membership and expanding our reach into the communities we serve, we are inspired by the 6,477 girls we had the honor of serving this year, and grateful for the 3,647 volunteers who made it possible. CELEBRATING 110 YEARS

For 110 years, Girl Scouts have been a force for positive change in our world, tackling issues in their communities, helping others, and leading into the future. Whether reaching the outer limits of space or stocking their local food pantry, there is no challenge too big or need too small for a Girl Scout to tackle. Since day one, girls have found a way to create a better future for themselves, their communities, and the world. This year we celebrate the problem solvers, go-getters, dreamers, and doers who are creating a better future for us all.

In 2021-2022, Girl Scouts of Southeast Florida saw membership increase over the previous year, a positive step in GSSEF's overall recovery following the pandemic. Nine of our nineteen service units were recognized for welcoming new girls and exceeding their girl membership goal.

In the last quarter of 2021-22 when students were returning to schools, so were our recruiters. Volunteers and staff members attended and participated in more than 100 back to school recruitment events, sharing the benefits of joining an organization that provides the best leadership experiences for girls.

The positive response from these events contributed to meeting the year's goals as well as creating new troops and participation opportunities—allowing more girls to experience Girl Scouts in the coming year.



STEM





OUTDOORS

Research shows that girls are keenly interested in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) and excel at it. Yet, for a variety of reasons, girls often don't pursue STEM—starting as early as elementary school.

Girl Scouts lets girls see that STEM can help them make the world a better place! When girls participate in focused STEM programs, they become more interested in STEM subjects and careers in tech—including app development, robotics, coding, and cybersecurity—and they:

- Become better problem-solvers and critical thinkers (OR learn to think scientifically to solve problems)
- Have confidence in their STEM skills and abilities
- Get excited about STEM subjects and want to learn more about them
- Learn the importance and relevance of STEM to people and society and options for their own career paths

STEM WINTER WONDERLAND

December 13, 2021 • Virtual

Girl Scouts from across the USA explored the magical winter wonderland of STEM in this virtual self-paced program. Girl Scouts learned about chemical reactions while making a bath fizzer, crystals while making a snowman, melting/freezing points while making a hot chocolate bomb, and much more!



STEMAPALOOZA

May 7, 2022 • Cox Science Center and Aquarium Limitless, starry, boundless, and phenomenal. Like our Girl Scouts and the galaxy, this year's STEMapalooza was out of this world! Girl Scouts launched into our special after-hours access to the museum where we explored STEM at night, including demonstrations, activity booths, challenges, experiments, and more. We used the latest technology to stargaze and build star constellation maps, learned about nocturnal animals, and heard from female astronauts with AstraFemina – all while participating in space themed activities.

GIRL SCOUTS LOVE BUTTERFLIES

October 16, 2021 • Virtual

Girl Scouts took the flight of a lifetime as they discovered, explored, and took action for butterflies. This virtual experience included everything from the lifecycle of butterflies and the different species and characteristics, to why butterflies are so important to protect, and much more. Just like the butterflies, Girl Scouts also took a fantastic journey as we visited butterfly gardens and advocates in South Florida, Missouri, Minnesota, Michigan, and all the way to India!



RESIDENT CAMP 2022

July 2022 • Camp Welaka

We splashed back to Camp Welaka for resident camp in Summer 2022! Girl Scouts spent part of their summer the Girl Scout way having big adventures, making new discoveries, and creating lifelong memories in the great outdoors. There were five wacky, water-themed sessions to choose from based on Girl Scout's grade level and interest. Girl Scouts built more than just outdoor skills with us this summer as they explored outside their comfort zone and built confidence, independence, and responsibility with new friends in a new environment. They participated in the Girl Scout Tree Promise by planting over 1,850 trees this summer-including Loblolly Pines, Coco Plums, Elderberry, and Shrub Oak. Additionally, The Reef Institute hosted workshops on coral and its importance to the health of our oceans.

Studies show that today's girls are not spending nearly enough time outdoors. Technology distractions and structured activities leave less time for girls to be outside and appreciate nature. But as a Girl Scout, girls have plenty of opportunities to create outdoor adventures and develop a lifelong appreciation for the environment—whether with her troop, at camp, or with friends and family.

And that's great news because when Girl Scouts get outside, they:

- Discover that they can better solve problem and overcome challenges
- Develop leadership skills, build social bonds, and are happier overall
- Become team players and care more about protecting our environment

BE KIND TO YOUR MIND

November 13, 2021 • Florida Atlantic University Be Kind to Your Mind is a program centered on girls exploring the topic of self-care through expert-led teachings and small group discussions. This year, Girl Scouts focused on self-care: what it is and how to find the best forms for each person, how to identify burnout, a discussion on mindfulness, and common ways people perform self-care acts. Girl Scouts were able to define what self-care means to them, communicate when they are feeling overwhelmed or stressed, identify a variety of self-care techniques, and practice being present during everyday activities. Each Girl Scout was able to take home their own yoga mat, so they can engage in activities they learned during the program in their personal life.



May 1, 2022 • Okeeheelee Park

On your mark. Get set. GO! The Thin Mint Sprint 5K was back for its 11th year to encourage Girl Scouts and the community to get outdoors and get active. Open to all ages, this year's event also included a new program, our Family Fun Run where girls and their families could get active and test their skills in this year's superhero-themed program. Girl Scouts jammed out with our DJ before and after the run and participated in four activity stations along the way. The program kicked off by getting suited up and moving their bodies with Zumba before flying off to embark on our superhero training. Girl Scouts were also able to earn their Trail Adventure Badge in partnership with Holy Cross Health.

MENTOR ME

October 23, 2021 • Signature Grand

Mentor Me, an exclusive event for Cadettes, Seniors, and Ambassadors, is a networking brunch focused on connecting older Girl Scouts with women in the workforce. Not only did they get to role-play their inner boss, but Girl Scouts also participated in a leadership workshop presented by State Farm, a speed mentoring session with powerful women paving the way in a variety of industries, and received their professional headshots. This program was an opportunity to explore different career paths, network with fellow like-minded Girl Scouts, and learn vital business skills that will prepare older Girl Scouts for their future. Mentors from the following companies supported the program: Holy Cross Health, Community Foundation of Broward, DNA Labs International, Broward Sheriff's Office, State Farm and more.



January 22, 2022 • Palm Beach County Convention Center and on-demand

At this annual event, Girl Scouts maximized their Cookie CEO expertise by getting S.M.A.R.T.—that's Savvy, Motivated, Artistic, Responsible, and Technical—through the S.M.A.R.T. Cookie program. Girl Scouts earned their new Cookie Business Badge and receive the 2022 S.M.A.R.T. Cookie patch, while gaining skills and knowledge to take on the 2022 Cookie Program like a boss. Girls engaged in fun workshops with our cookie experts while developing the five essential skills gained through participation in the Girl Scout Cookie Program. Because of funding provided by Fiserv, 100 Girl Scouts were able to attend the program for free!

Research shows that girls are actively interested in becoming entrepreneurs, developing financially stable futures, and using their skills to make a big impact on the world.

But there are stumbling blocks on a girl's path, including fear of failure, concerns about bringing big ideas to life, and the perception that men are more likely to be entrepreneurs than women. While entrepreneurship may not be right for every girl, every Girl Scout will benefit, and maybe even discover a future career path, by learning to think like an entrepreneur.

As an important part of learning vital business skills, girls will:

- Discover how to set and achieve realistic goals in their lives and future careers
- Make better decisions and build stronger interpersonal skills
- Develop a valuable work ethic and a sense of empathy for others


CREATING COOKIE ENTREPRENEURS

Thanks to 3,747 girls and 415 troops, and all of the family and friends that support them, the 2022 GSSEF Cookie Sale Program was a great success! Girl Scouts put the five entrepreneurial skills they learned into action and "Climbed with Courage" to achieve their goals.

In 2022, **1,221,867 boxes of cookies were sold**, a 31.71% increase over the prior year. Of the more than 1.2 million boxes, 344,930 of them were sold through Digital Cookie making this the highest number girls have ever sold through the online platform. It's an increase of 38.3% from 2021. The Cookie sale grossed almost \$6 million, with nearly \$1.1 MILLION going directly to our troops as earned proceeds.

Our community donated **60,126 boxes through the** Cookies for the Military program and 80 girls were invited to a special packing event over the summer as a result of their participation in the program. To date, more than 700,000 boxes of cookies have been donated to our soldiers serving in the military.

NEW THIS YEAR! Twenty-seven girls learned the 5 P's —Prospect, Proposal & Pitch, Procure, and Partner—by completing the new Corporate Cookie Connections patch program. Congratulations to Sadie S. from Troop 10804 who was the top corporate connector securing \$3,600 in sponsorships. Thirty-two troops participated in the Door Dash partnership, generating \$39,859 in sales through their delivery platform. Congratulations to Troop 24114 for generation \$5,200 in sales through Door Dash.


DIVERSITY, EQUITY, AND INCLUSION

Girl Scouts of Southeast Florida has added an equity pillar to its programming to "intentionally and boldly demonstrate a positive culture built upon diversity, equity, inclusion, and accountability."

The Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Series (D.E.I) is focused on educating Girl Scouts on history and topics surrounding communities and identity groups that they may or may not belong to. This will lead them to greater understanding of these communities and their cultures, how our differences should be celebrated, their own identity, and how they can educate others.

BLACK HISTORY MONTH

February 2022

During the Black History Month Virtual Celebration, Girl Scouts learned more about the history of the Black community and the many cultures that are a part of it. After a brief presentation, they had the opportunity to be a part of our Black History Month showcase. Girls were encouraged to choose their favorite art form and create an original piece centered around Black history in advance of the event.



PRIDE MONTH

June 2022

During Pride month, we designed program options that highlight the impacts made by LGBTQ+ trailblazers and understand the history of this relatively new, nationally designated month. With something for each grade-level, the purpose of this focus area is to uncover the impact that LGBTQ+ individuals have had on history and celebrate the LBGTQ+ community. Programs share the earliest days of LGBTQ+ activism and celebrate how far we have come as we choose to support equal rights. We strive to create space for Allies who want to support understanding, acceptance, and growth. In one program, interactive discussions were built around education and meaning of the colorful Pride flag. Girls and their family members were highly engaged in conversations about the diversity of the LGBTQ+ community. Preconceived notions were soon replaced a deeper understand of the true themes found in this rainbow, including nature, life, healing, and serenity.

LEARNING AS A TEAM

The GSSEF Equity Team collectively planned a "Share Your Culture" day on April 7, 2022 for their colleagues that encouraged understanding and togetherness for all cultures in the world. Food, history, art, and artifacts from all over the globe were shared and appreciated.

The GSSEF staff also had various learning opportunities through the year including presentations on fostering diversity, equity, and inclusion, and multi-generational learning styles. In addition, quarterly DEI lunch & learn offerings were launched starting with a presentation on white dominant culture. Information was also shared periodically in the staff newsletter through "DEI did you know?" topics and history regarding Black History, Indigenous Peoples Day, Pride month, Asian American history, and Hispanic Heritage month.

LIFETIME SERVICE AWARD SANDY CLUTTER

Girl Scouts has a long and proud tradition of volunteer service; individuals who volunteer in dozens of capacities influencing the lives of thousands of girls each year. Introduced by GSSEF in 2014, the Lifetime Service Award recognizes individuals who have made extraordinary contributions to the Girl Scout mission through consistent and far-reaching acts of volunteerism that has resulted in strengthening of the organization.

Sandy Clutter was the recipient of the 2022 **Lifetime Service Award.** She is a lifetime member of Girl Scouts and is a Gold Award Girl Scout. She has been a troop leader for most, if not all of her more than 30+ years as a volunteer. She leads Troop 20441, a multi-level troop for girls in middle and high school, but has made a lasting impact on literally thousands of girls over the years through this role and through all of the program opportunities she has made possible for girls.

"I have actually never known Girl Scouts without Sandy," said Lisa Johnson, CEO of Girl Scouts of Southeast Florida. "When I came to GSSEF in 1996, she was already an active volunteer with the legacy Palm Glades Council. And for the last 25 years I have watched her share her passion for Girl Scouts with so many girls and adults."

Sandy volunteers at the troop, service unit and council level. She is an outdoor trainer, helping leaders become ready to take their troops camping and she is certified in both small watercraft and archery. Sandy also serves as a Gold Award Advisor and has guided many Girl Scouts as they pursue this prestigious high award. In addition to receiving the Lifetime Service Award this year, she has previously received the Appreciation Pin, Honor Pin and Volunteer of Excellence Award as well as the highest GSUSA adult awards, the Thanks and Thanks II Badges.

PARTNERING TOGETHER

PALM BEACH COUNTY YOUTH SERVICES DEPARTMENT

Girls face concerning educational, emotional, social, and career disadvantages compared to their boy counterparts and need our help now more than ever. Girl Scouts of Southeast Florida has partnered with Palm Beach County Youth Services Department though a new grant initiative through 2024 that is working to help combat this. Participating in the Girl Scout Leadership Experience (GSLE) helps girls develop important leadership skills they need to become successful adults. When these Girl Scout activities are girl-led, cooperative, and hands-on, girls show greater benefits. In a recent survey conducted by the Girl Scout Research Institute, girls who experienced the Girl Scout processes—Girl Led, Cooperative Learning, and Learning by Doing—outperformed their peers on all GSLE outcomes measured.

Through our partnership this year, we have served over 750 girls. The Palm Beach County results, in alignment with studies done by the Girl Scout Research Institute, confirm that Girl Scouting has a strong, positive impact on girls, helping them develop into citizens who are responsible, caring, and engaged—and prepared for a lifetime of leadership. Additionally, we are working to partner with more schools and community organizations to ensure the Girl Scout Leadership Experience is available to all girls.






