### What is Summer Funshine?

- ✓ Complete at least one approved activity in at least two of the three categories (below) during the months of June, July, or August.
- ✓ Submit the official form by **September 15** to order the patches\*.

\*Cost for Summer Funshine waffle cone patch is \$3.00 each, cost for each ice cream topper is \$2.00 each, plus tax.

### DISCOVER

- o Work on a Girl Scout Badge or Journey.
- o Visit a historic landmark, local treasure, museum, or state park.
- Research community needs and create
  project ideas for a Bronze, Silver, or
  Gold Award project proposal.
- Start a daily journal that captures your discoveries, ideas, goals, and challenges.
- o Interview a family member to discover facts about your heritage, origin, or fun stories you've never heard of.
- Attend an organized event or gathering in your community for the first time, such as a festival, worship service, exercise class, team sport, or Girl Scout program.

### CONNECT

- Participate in a troop activity. (i.e. nature walk, S.W.A.P.-making soirée, learn Girl Scout songs, or practice a flag ceremony).
- Participate in a family activity. (i.e. picnic, camping trip, game night, movie marathon, or specialty meal).
- Connect with local troop leaders to teach a Girl Scout lesson, skill, song, ceremony, or program to a group of younger girls.
- Attend a council program and introduce yourself to at least one new person to explain Summer Funshine.
- Send a letter or email to an elected official about an important issue you care about; include details about why you're communicating and your ideas for a solution.

### TAKE ACTION

- Volunteer, at least two hours, at a nonprofit organization, day camp, school, or place of worship.
- Make a personal or family donation to a dependable organization that will distribute food, clothing, books, toys, etc. to those in need.
- Present a Flag Ceremony to a group such as The American Legion, veterans' services centers, municipalities, or other special events.
- Plan a community service project, such as a Back To School supply drive, or join an organized project like a clean-up.
- Work on a "Take Action" project as part of a Journey or High Award you're earning.
- Volunteer to assist your troop or service unit with Fall recruitment activities.
