Applicant Qualifications:

- Be a currently registered member of Girl Scout in the Girl Scouts of Southeast Florida (GSSEF);
- Have maintained GSSEF membership for a minimum of 3 years;
- Be in 11th or 12th grade in the current 25/26 academic year;
- Have a minimum, unweighted GPA of 3.0; and
- Intend to pursue specialized, post-high school education in a certificate or license-seeking trade or vocation that requires skill specific learning or an undergraduate associate's degree.

Application Process:

Submit the three following documents in one email to customer care@gssef.org with subject line "Robin Trapani Scholarship" by April 6, 2026 at 11:59 p.m.:

1. Provide this information at the top of the essay page, in a simple bulleted list:
 - Applicant's full name, age, home address, cell phone number, email address, current school grade, high school name, and total years as a Girl Scout member
 - Personal Essay, maximum of 500 words:
 - What type vocational trade or skilled job do you intend to pursue after high school?
 - Explain the education, certificate, apprenticeship, or licensing that this will require.
 - Share why this type of work or industry interests you.
 - Tell us how the representation of females (or lack of them) in this industry influences your decision to work within it.
 - How has your participation in the Girl Scout program prepared or excited you for pursuit of this line of work?
2. Provide a 1-page resume-style list of extra-curricular activities; this should include community engagement activities such as volunteering and include any paid employment since age 15.
3. Provide a Fall 2025 transcript that demonstrates an unweighted GPA of 3.0 or higher.

Other Details:

- The 2026 recipient is expected to attend the ceremony on May 9, 2026 at DoubleTree by Hilton Deerfield Beach Boca Raton, 100 Fairway Dr, Deerfield Beach, FL 33441 from 9 - 11:30 a.m.
- The recipient will be provided with a form (via email) to provide proof of registration and student identification number so funds may be forwarded directly to the institution in the student's name.
- Should the recipient be in 11th grade now, the form will be provided in June 2027 and funding allocated in September 2027. Please keep GSSEF updated with preferred email contact information.
