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The recipient of the 2025 ECHO Scholarship will receive \$3,000.00 toward her education at college or university.

Eligibility

To be eligible for consideration, the candidate must:

- Be a currently registered Girl Scout in the GSSEF Council;
- Be a current high school student;
- Have earned the Girl Scout Bronze Award or Silver Award;
- Have earned the Girl Scout Gold Award; and
- Have demonstrated exemplary citizenship in school, Girl Scouting, and the community.

Submission & Dates

- Applications are due by April 7, 2025 at 11:59 p.m. The recipient will be notified by May 2.

- The recipient is expected to attend the presentation at the Gold Award Ceremony on May 10, 2025 from 9:00 – 11:30 a.m.

- A form will be provided to the recipient so scholarship funds can be forwarded directly to the college or university.
- Should the recipient be in 9th-11th grades, the form will be provided in June immediately following high school graduation and funding will be allocated the following September. Please keep GSSEF updated with preferred email contact information.

Applications must include the following:

- **School Participation Record** — maximum of one-sided page, include a resume-style record of the candidate's school-related activities, academic achievements, offices held, honors received and significant participation, etc.
- **Community Service Record** — maximum of one-sided page, include a resume-style record of the candidate's participation in/for service organizations (excluding Girl Scouting and school), earned awards, leadership positions, participation in notable activities, etc.
- **Girl Scouts Record** — maximum of one-sided page, include a resume-style record of the candidate's Girl Scouts participation; include all years of participation with troop numbers (if applicable), earned awards, leadership positions, and notable activities. Must include details about the Bronze or Silver Award project(s) and describe the candidate's Gold Award project, with specific details about the project's sustainability and total service hours dedicated to the National High Award projects.
- **Reflection Essay** — maximum of 1,000 words that provides a reflection of the most meaningful experiences in Girl Scouting; be sure to share what you have discovered about yourself and the world. Share your opinion on the importance and value of earning The Gold Award, including what you learned, the ways it engaged others, and how it will be sustained - and why younger Girl Scouts should set a personal goal to earn The Gold Award too.
